Fables, myths, and legends are ways to look into the past!





## **Fables Teach**

## "The Tortoise and the Hare"

"The **Tortoise** and the **Hare**" is one of Aesop's fables. In it, a hare and tortoise have a race. The hare thinks he will win, so he takes a nap—and loses!

The lesson in "The Tortoise and the Hare" is "slow but **steady** wins the race."

## **Myths Explain**

Myths are stories about gods and heroes. They often **explain** why things happen. **Ancient** people believed myths were true. There are many myths about how the world was created.

### FAST FACT

Ancient Greeks, Romans, Egyptians, Native Americans, and **Norsemen** had myths.



Greek myths say that the god Poseidon created horses.



## **Myths and Nature**

## Apollo and the Sun

Apollo was the son of Zeus, the king of the Greek gods. Each day, Apollo rode a golden **chariot** through the air. This myth explained why the sun moved across the sky.

Ancient Romans gave many of the Greek gods new names. Zeus was Jupiter to the Romans.





The legend of Washington chopping down the tree tells us that Americans value telling the truth.


